

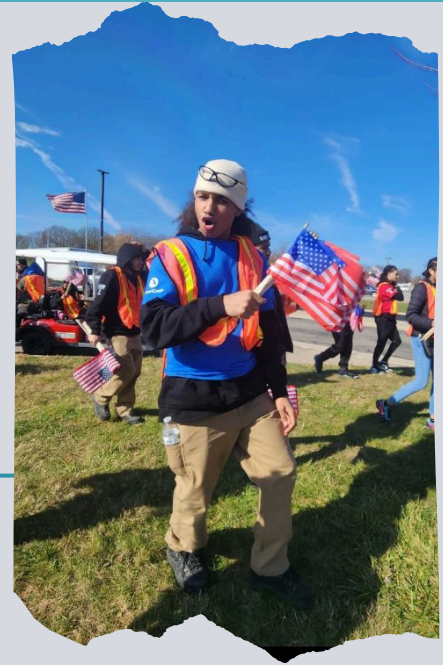
# Liberty High School Our Beloved Community 2024

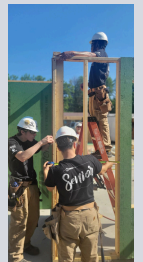


# Dayton Home Repair Network

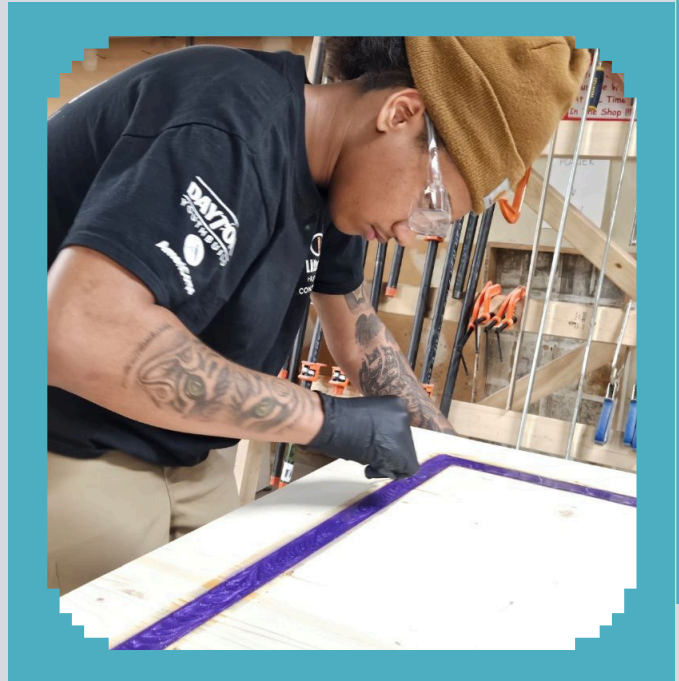

# Dining Tables for The New Path, Inc.



Liberty High School Construction students built and donated four dining tables to The New Path, Inc.'s furniture ministry. This faith-based organization distributes home furnishings and household items to those leaving shelters, victims of domestic violence, and fire and flood victims. Recipients who successfully complete a recovery program are also eligible. Bill Lutz, Executive Director, shared his appreciation with the students stating that dining tables are the heart of the home that brings families together where they talk and share in the life events of each other.



The Dayton Foodbank and Liberty High School partnership continues to flourish. Students distributed over 200 boxes of food for area senior citizens as well as families participating in the Good-To-Go Backpack Program. This program provides area students identified as being at-risk for food insecurity with nutritious, easy-to-prepare meals for the weekend. In these packages, Liberty students included handwritten notes of encouragement.
